As the Division of Research is taking shape, our interim Vice Chancellors have taken a look at where we came from, where we are, and where we want to go. Drs. Daniels and Thomas reinforced that the Office of Research is interested in doing research the 'Niner Way' - what does this mean? They explained that this means using the information gathered by looking at the past and present, they aim to create the framework for facilitating our process to becoming an R1 institution in a way that maintains our values, community, and supporting all areas of our University. It is a framework that depends upon the Niner Way to work.

Dr. Daniels reinforced that our transition to R1 is not a decision that has been made arbitrarily...

Charlotte is the largest city of North and South Carolina - there is a need and an opportunity for UNC Charlotte to be the premier research university in the Carolinas and we have the resources locally to do so.

Dr. Gaber's vision for UNC Charlotte places research and

development, along with the transition to an R1 institution in her top three priorities for the University. Enrollment falls within these three priorities as well. This is the driving force in the decoupling of enrollment management and research offices to create two new units which each support either enrollment or research.

Transitioning to an R1 institution has benefits for all members of our communities on campus - staff, faculty, administration, students - and off campus in the surrounding areas.

It was highlighted that Charlotte is the 15th largest city in the country, and the city you have to drive furthest from to reach an R1 designated institution. Why allow this to be the case when we could have our own R1 institution right here in Charlotte?! Dr. Daniels pointed out that we aren't really serving the city of Charlotte or the state of North Carolina if we aren't growing our apparatus, refining our tools, and harnessing the resources around us to become a top tier research institution.

Krissy Kaylor, Director of Benefits

Krissy Kaylor came to discuss the upcoming benefits open enrollment period, which will begin on October 9th and run through October 27, 2023.

Some reminders:

- There is a difference between your selection and your effective date changes go into effect as of Jan 1, 2024, as long as you make your elections during the open enrollment period.
- <u>The Benefits Website</u> will be updated and webinars with more information about open enrollment will be posted.
- The Novant Health Mobile Breast Center will be on campus and taking appointments for mammograms on October 19th. You must schedule an appointment in advance, to do so please call 704-384-7226.
- Benefits will also have a booth at the Fall Festival so please come by with any
 questions and encourage those in your area to do so as well.

- There are no changes for the State Health Plan
 premiums this year. These will remain the same, assuming you have completed your
 tobacco attestation that is required during open enrollment to offset the cost of
 premiums.
 - You must take action whether you are a tobacco user or not, to save on the premium... the tobacco attestation is only for you, you do not have to attest to dependents or partners.
 - A question was asked as to whether or not vaping is considered tabacco use...
 Krissy send this excerpt from the tobacco attestation which does include vaping:
 - I attest that I am NOT a tobacco user (includes cigarettes, cigars, pipes, chewing tobacco, snuff, vaping or any product containing nicotine). Or if I am a tobacco user, I agree to complete at least one tobacco cessation counseling session within the first 90 days of my hire date. (Please note: You may lose your \$60 monthly premium credit if you do not visit an in-network Primary Care Provider for a tobacco cessation counseling session within 90 days of your hire date.) As part of this attestation, I understand that making a false statement, representation or attestation could result in my termination from State Health Plan coverage. I also agree to cooperate with the Plan in any efforts to verify my tobacco status.
- Don't forget!! If you're enrolled in the State Health Plan currently, you will automatically be re-enrolled in the 70/30 plan. If you want 80/20 you must take action to update your enrollment to the 80/20 plan.
- The dental plan with NC FLEX will have premium increases this year for the high plan and the low plan. The classic plan will remain the same, with no increase.
- The amount of money in your flexible spending account that can roll over will be
 increasing as well meaning you can continue to roll over any FSA funds that go
 unused up to a certain amount, and that amount is higher in the coming year than it has
 been.

- Don't forget you can use FSA monies on healthcare expenses for partners and dependents that are not on your insurance plan. The spending just has to be FSA eligible.
- The accident plan names are changing, but there will be no changes to the actual plan themselves.
- **REMINDER!** Benefit elections are made on two different platforms.
 - E-Benefits will be used for health insurance only.
 - All other elections will be made through Imperian. Make sure you receive a confirmation once you have made your elections - if you do not receive a confirmation your elections did not go through!
 - If you have a qualifying life event that requires you to make changes to your elections you must do so within 30 days on BOTH platforms.








Distance to the Nearest R1 University



City (in order of population)




Research Expenditures in Metro Areas








NSF HERD Projected Scenario Expenditures


