Mike Lizotte, University Sustainability Officer, Office of Sustainability

- The Office of Sustainability is responsible for helping to develop skills to meet the sustainability goals of the campus.
- The office has no single bottom line such as watching the amount of money that can be invested in sustainability efforts, rather, their role is care of the people on campus and aligning our environmental concerns with the campus at large.
- Chancellor Gaber has included sustainability work into the strategic plan based on its importance to the university Objective D1.2 make the university national leader in sustainability.
- ASHE, the Association of Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education developed the tool we use (STARS) to attain this leadership credential. STARS is comprised of about 100 metrics and we are very close to "gold" level so it is a priority to continue to create pathways needed to actually achieve Gold status.
- One big highlight for the Office of Sustainability is that they are adding employee educator programs. Previously one program had been created for units and now they are in the process of creating one specifically for individuals.
